PRESIDENT

DAVID PHEENEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The David Pheenev Memorial Scholarship, is awarded on an annual basis to a club member entering into Year 12 HSC studies and, in the event there being no such person, applications will be invited from Year 12 students at the MORUYA HIGH SCHOOL

The Scholarship shall have a minimum value of \$250.00, and is to be used for the purchase of text books and other requirements relative to the HSC examination.

A sub-committee of three persons, two of whom shall be LIFE MEMBERS of the Club, select the recipient and the sub-committee may co-opt the views of other members of the MORUYA SLSC or staff of the particular secondary education facility

The criteria shall be -

- (a) Applicants to have physically commenced the final year of HSC studies*
- (b) Applicants to be actual patrolling members of the MORUYA SLSC, except that where there are no such applicants, applications are invited from students of MORUYA HIGH SCHOOL.;*

3. Applications in writing, of not less than 250 words in length, must be made and the sub-committee shall base its decision on the following aspects but not limited thereto, nor in any particular order of relevance -

- (i) Club membership record*
- (ii) Participation within the Club*
- (iii) Citizenship*
- (iv) Academic record*
- (v) Presentation of the written application*
- (vi) Appraisal of an applicant at a personal interview, should the sub-committee deem it expedient*
- (vii) Personal economic position of applicant*

5. The sub-committee shall furnish a recommendation to the Club Management Committee for ratification ; ratification shall be final and no further discussion or correspondence shall be entertained.

TREASURER

Once again we were fortunate to have significant funds injected into our Club through some generous donations and sponsorships. Dial Before You Dig remain a committed and valued supporter, providing \$7000 in sponsorship and being the major supporter of the annual Town To Surf Fun Run. Cameron's Hardware continued their 3-year agreement with \$5000 towards the purchase of a new surfboat. Eurobodalla Shire Council's annual contribution this year was \$5185, which goes towards the major running costs such as insurance. A successful Equipment Grant application to SLSS NSW resulted in \$5000 for the purchase of a new IRB motor. Several Grants were received for Special Nippers, along with many generous donations, allowing for the purchase of a new beach wheelchair, boards, PFD's and volunteer and participant clothing. Another successful grant application resulted in the receipt of \$30,000 towards the new kitchen. Some appliances and minor equipment have been purchased this year, with the bulk of the work to happen in 2017.

The Town to Surf Fun Run remains our major fundraiser for the year, this year grossing over \$10,000 and resulting in a profit of \$6648. For most members this event requires just half a day's commitment to help out in some way, well worth the effort for the return we receive. Those members who helped out at the Batemans Bay Triathlon also gained a healthy financial reward for the Club to the tune of \$2200. These events, together with the race carparking, are our major fundraisers, and if everyone could commit to doing just one, it would certainly spread the load and maintain the solid financial position of the Club.
