MEMBERSHIP & REGISTRAR

Moruya SLSC continued with healthy membership numbers seeing another increase in overall membership in season 2016/17.

Of note is an increase in Junior Activity Members (nippers) and Active members.

The number of General members has fallen, partly due to a small decrease in the number of people joining specifically to help with Special Nippers, and more nipper parents completed their Bronze Medallion and moved from General to Active membership. A pleasing trend, reinforcing the importance of nippers to the club.

Cadet and Junior numbers remain low. This is partly due to attrition; the club had good numbers of teenagers doing the Junior program and in boat crews a few years back. Retention and recruitment of high school students is obviously something to work on again.

PRESIDENTS REPORT 2016-17 SEASON

As I pen my second report as President I look back upon the 2016/17 season with very mixed emotions. I see all the wonderful things that a very committed group of people have achieved and provided to our community on so many differing levels yet I also see that if we are not prepared to allow a new generation to steer the club in the direction that they believe we need to travel then the consequences for us as an ongoing concern may be jeopardised.

I thank Bert Hunt once again for his support this season and commend him for his efforts in leading change that is positive for the Surf Life Saving movement nationally. I also thank him for stimulating discussion with his Vision for Surf Clubs correspondence

It is quite obvious from responses received that we all have a very strong sense of belonging to the club. As is expected, one person's view on the way we move forward will differ from another. The challenge for us as an organisation is to ensure that all this passion is channelled in a way that will benefit the club well into the future.

The completion of the Steg Bar has now enabled us to transition into regular Friday night sippers and the South Heads community is richer for this social meeting place. The ability to attract people outside our normal core group of volunteers and be able to generate revenue and more importantly community interest in the facilities that we provide is paramount to our longevity as a community organisation. I see this as an integral part of the club moving towards being somewhat financially independent if we get the model right. Thank you to everyone that has provided their time to ensure the success of this wonderful addition to our social calendar. A special mention to Ainslie Scully, Andy Baker Brad Coppin and Michael Weyman who are so giving of their time to ensure that the sippers are consuming responsibly. For us to be able to provide a top class function facility, derive income from it and reduce the burden on members to constantly seek out ways to obtain funds to purchase the necessary equipment to continue to contribute to the community is paramount. This is not to say that we ignore sponsorship opportunities or stop submitting grant applications, more so that we can reduce the need to call on members to give up large portions of precious family time outside of their normal patrolling commitments.

The Sunday timed handicapped swim is a very positive "Back to the Future" re-introduction. While I have not participated in the Sunday swims, anything that improves our member's confidence and abilities in the surf is welcomed. I also believe that we need to adopt an open house policy, for current financial members, on the use of equipment that has been identified as training equipment. Having come through the club in an era where the equipment was chained up and only available for competition use, it was difficult to obtain the necessary skills required to be competent on the equipment.

I thank Karyn Starmer for all her hard work in maintaining our membership data base and am pleased to report that the Club has steady membership numbers. What I question within these numbers, (and this is not meant as a slight on our members but merely playing devil's advocate) is how many of our current membership base would feel comfortable entering the water when the proverbial hits the fan, the sea is less than friendly and not feel that they have placed themselves in a situation that they cannot handle. Good or bad, gone are the days when the patrol would close the beach to Joe Public because the surf was too dangerous and then proceed to take out rescue craft (be it boards or IRB's) or go body surfing to sharpen their skills. Sound beach management and our new patrol agreement allowing us to better utilise Shelly Beach significantly reduces this rescue scenario but we still need to ensure that we are skilled and trained to handle the worst case scenario's.

As a positive, the implementation of our new Patrol agreement saw the introduction of roving patrols to Shelley Beach during the peak Christmas season. A massive thank you to everyone that have given up a significant amount of personal time to obtain qualifications that will benefit the Club. I would like to make special mention of Darcy Coppin, our Junior Life Saver of the Year and Ainslie Scully, Rookie Life Saver of the Year for Far South Coast Branch. Your dedication to the Surf Life Saving movement and to the Moruya SLSC is very much appreciated. I also congratulate all our award winners from Presentation Night, none more so than our most recent Life Member inductees. The recognition of Lesley Pheeney, Nerida Johnson, Shaun and Tracey Pike for the contributions they have made to our great club are long overdue.

In my report last year I spoke of the challenges that we faced in generating enough revenue to purchase a new ATV. I am pleased to advise that, with the support of Southern Phones and Surf Life Saving Australia we are now the proud owners of a shiny new ATV. This vehicle will greatly assist our ability to provide the roving patrols that proved to be so successful this season.

Once again we must reflect on those that we have lost and this year is no different. Not wanting to offend anyone, I pass on my deepest sympathies to all our members that have been affected by the loss of a loved one throughout this season. I make special mention of Margie Pike who made the best bacon and eggs with lime cordial of a Saturday morning you could wish for. The position of club Secretary is integral in the successful running of any organization and we have been extremely fortunate this season that the position was filled by Jeff Morgan. Thank you doesn't go anywhere near covering my gratitude for your tireless efforts and you leave extremely large shoes to fill. I look forward to catching up with you from time to time over summer.

DAVID PHEENEY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The David Pheene Memorial Scholarship, is awarded on an annual basis to a club member entering into Year 12 HSC studies and, in the event there being no such person, applications will be invited from Year 12 students at the MORUYA HIGH SCHOOL

The Scholarship shall have a minimum value of \$250.00, and is to be used for the purchase of text books and other requirements relative to the HSC examination.

A sub-committee of three persons, two of whom shall be LIFE MEMBERS of the Club, select the recipient and the sub-committee may co-opt the views of other members of the MORUYA SLSC or staff of the particular secondary education facility

The criteria shall be -

- (a) Applicants to have physically commenced the final year of HSC studies*
- (b) Applicants to be actual patrolling members of the MORUYA SLSC, except that where there are no such applicants, applications are invited from students of MORUYA HIGH SCHOOL ;*

3. Applications in writing, of not less than 250 words in length, must be made and the sub-committee shall base its decision on the following aspects but not limited thereto, nor in any particular order of relevance -

- (i) Club membership record*
- (ii) Participation within the Club*
- (iii) Citizenship*
- (iv) Academic record*
- (v) Presentation of the written application*
- (vi) Appraisal of an applicant at a personal interview, should the sub-committee deem it expedient*
- (vii) Personal economic position of applicant*

5. The sub-committee shall furnish a recommendation to the Club Management Committee for ratification ; ratification shall be final and no further discussion or correspondence shall be entertained.

TREASURER

We have had some significant sponsorship and donations over the last twelve months.

A donation of \$5,500 from Southern Phone was a very generous gift and contributed toward the ATV purchase. Elite Energy also made a donation of \$1600.00.

Friday Sippers has proved to be a huge success as a popular social event and a great fundraiser.

SLSNSW unexpectedly presented us with a cheque of \$5,801. This was our club's share of SLSNSW fundraising that takes place outside the front of a couple of local supermarkets – great to see these funds returning to local clubs – thank you.

Funds of \$2,147 from the Moruya Race Day as well as various donations from many others has ensured that the Club has had a very successful year.

Other initiatives including new uniform designs (swimwear, hooded towels and hooded windcheaters) have also proved popular with members and are generating funds for the club.

Thank you to Catfish Designs for their support and their generous sponsorship of two of our juniors, Maddie Bolton and Ryley Spoelder-Hanlon as Catfish athletes.

The new kitchen is fully functional and has enabled the Club to hire out the venue for many functions over the past year.

Thank you to all members who have contributed to our club over the past season; this is what enables Moruya SLSC to open it's doors and successfully patrol the beach.

This past season saw our club sign a new patrolling agreement which authorises our members to patrol Main beach as well as rove Shelley Beach and the swimming zone adjacent to Dolphin Brach Caravan Park during the peak December-January period. This proved successful; patrolling statistics indicated swimmer numbers at Shelley beach often exceeded those at Main beach as well as a rescue performed during one roving session at Shelley Beach.

This season we've seen members participate in a range of activities - Special nippers, Sunday nippers, nipper board training, surfboat competitions, youth leadership camps, local carnival beach, surf competitions and the return of a club swim; as well as supporting other local organisations and events - Bay Triathlon, Australia Day rescue demonstration, car parking organisation/fundraising at local races... and primarily... patrolling our beach!



Our patrolling membership has shifted this season; our patrolling groups combine to a total of 76 active 18yrs+ members and 10 cadet 15-18 years patrolling members. 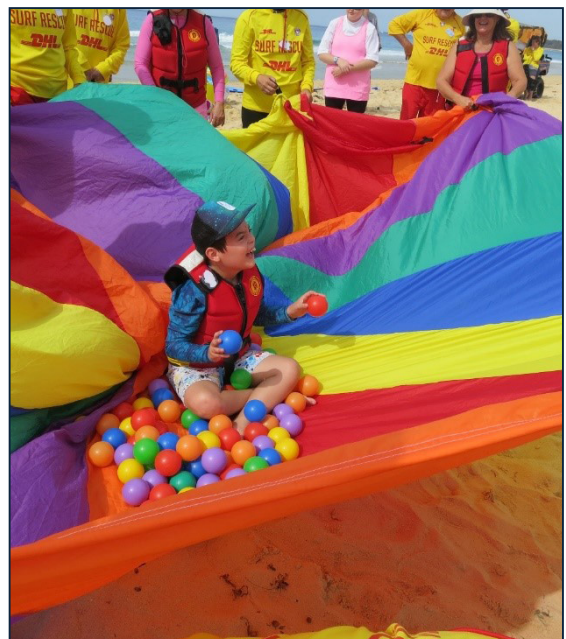
